


## **ABOUT US**

This allows campers to curate a truly unique experience and explore their interests! Programs include field excursions, organism labs and dissections, team-building activities, and more. Campers will have the opportunity to explore NASA's Wallops Island, Chincoteague National Wildlife Refuge, and the coastal waters around Chincoteague from a research vessel.

Two different adventure tracks are offered to give our campers variety if they attend for multiple weeks!

### Marine Adventure (ages 9-11)

Marine Adventure day camps are full-day camps offered 8AM - 4:30PM. These camps focus primarily on spending time in the field and getting hands-on, feet-wet within our coastal ecosystems. Each day offers a morning and afternoon class block to allow campers to experience a large variety of different ecosystems and field sites!

### Coastal Studies (ages 12-15)

Coastal Studies day camps are full-day camps offered 8AM - 4:30PM. Our most advanced day camp, Coastal Studies allows campers to explore this unique coastal environment in in-depth ways. Campers will use a variety of data collection methods, including a cruise aboard a research vessel. This camp is perfect for an aspiring marine biologist!


# Homeschool Marine Science Adventure

### **Meeting Spaces**



### **Housing**

CBFS boasts two modern residence halls, Salicornia Suites and Red Knot Residence Hall. These suite-style dormitory accommodations have four bedrooms and two bathrooms per suite. They are fully climate-controlled with Wi-Fi and easy access to laundry facilities. Red Knot Residence Hall can accommodate a maximum of 14 guests per suite, and Salicornia Suites can accommodate up to 8 guests per suite. Each bedroom comes fully furnished with twin-sized beds, a nightstand, and a lamp. Salicornia Suites also offers desks and a dresser in each bedroom.

### FIELD STATION EDUCATORS


